Item No.1 Action taken report on the minutes of 23rd Meeting of Standing Committee for Academic Senate.

Item No.2. To approve the regulations, course structures and syllabi of M.Sc Food Technology and M.Sc Food Technology & Management at JNTUA, Ananthapuramu for which BoS meeting was held on 1st February 2021. These regulations, course structure, syllabi are applicable for the students admitted from 2020-21 academic year onwards.

The item is proposed by the Director of Evaluation, JNTUA and is seconded by the Principal JNTUA CEP.

Item No.4. Ratification of University Action for issue of B. Pharmacy Degree certificate to Ms. Bujjini Lavanya by rationalizing the credits from 174 to 176.

A student by name Ms. Bujjini Lavanya bearing HT No: 14GTR0007 who has applied for PC & CMM. In her letter she has stated that she had joined in the year 2014 at Sri Venkateswara College of Pharmacy, Chittoor under R13 regulations and completed 2nd year I semester. She had passed all the subjects and secured 62 credits out of 62. However, due to ill health, she got herself detained and readmitted in 2nd year II semester under R15 regulations of the University. She has cleared all the subjects from I B.Pharm. to IV B.Pharm. through University examinations and obtained a total of 174 credits including I year. However, as per R15 regulations a student is eligible for B.Pharm degree if he/she secures 176 credits.

Hence, the Director of Evaluation, JNTUA has referred the matter to the University and requested for necessary directions on the above issue. Under the above, circumstances, the University has constituted a committee to examine the issue and submit its recommendations.

Under the above circumstances, the University has constituted a committee to examine the issue. Accordingly, the committee examined the issue and submitted a detailed report and same has been approved in the note orders of the Vice-Chancellor

In this regard, the Director of Evaluation, JNTUA is directed to issue new Mark Memo to Ms. Bujjini Lavanya (14GTR0007) pertaining to I B.Pharmacy by enhancing the credits for Communicative English (13R52101) from 3 to 5 and enhance total credits from 174 to 176. Also to issue certificates to Ms. Bujjini Lavanya.

Item No 12. To discuss and modify the regulations for submission of panel of examiners for evaluation of PhD thesis

Existing regulation

The supervisor has to submit 12 examiners (out of which, 03 examiners from IITs/IISc/IIITs (Central Govt.) / Central Government R&D Institutions or equivalent, 03 examiners from NITs/Central Universities/State Government R&D Institutions or equivalent, 03 examiners from state government Universities/State Govt. IITs outside Andhra Pradesh and 03 examiners from state Government Universities/State Govt. IIITs within Andhra Pradesh.

Vice-Chancellor, shall recommend only three examiners out of 12 examiners submitted by the Supervisor and Co-Supervisor.

Proposed Regulation

Examiners:

1. a) The supervisor will furnish a panel of 09 examiners, out of which, (a) minimum 03 examiners from IITs/IISc/IISERs/IIMs, (b) minimum of 03 examiners from IIITs (Central Govt.)/Central Government R&D Institutions or equivalent/ NITs/Central Universities and (c) maximum of 03 examiners from State Government Universities/State Govt. IIITs.
- b) In the case of Pharmacy discipline, the supervisor will furnish a panel of 09 examiners, out of which, (a) minimum of 06 examiners from NIPER/Centrally Funded Institutions or Research organizations, (b) a maximum of 03 examiners from State Government Universities/State Govt. IIITs.
- c) In the case of English discipline, the supervisor will furnish a panel of 09 examiners, out of which, (a) minimum of 06 examiners from IITs/NITs/ EFLUs/Central Universities (b) a maximum of 03 examiners from State Government Universities/State Govt. IIITs

Note:

- i. Out of the 09 examiners, maximum of 03 examiners shall be within the state of Andhra Pradesh.
 - ii. No examiner shall be drawn from JNTUA and the Institute/University where the Supervisor(s)/scholars are employed
 - iii. The Vice Chancellor is authorized to change the examiner(s), if the panel submitted by the Supervisor is not satisfactory
2. The Vice Chancellor will nominate 03 examiners in consultation with experts in the relevant discipline
 3. The Vice Chancellor shall, out of the panel of 12 examiners, select and appoint three examiners.
