JAWAHARLAL NEHRU TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY ANANTAPUR

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR THE AWARD OF M.C.A. DEGREE (WITH EFFECT FROM THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021)

The Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Anantapur shall confer M.C.A Post Graduate degree to candidates who are admitted to the Master of Computer Application Programs and fulfill all the requirements for the award of the degree.

1. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSIONS:

Admission to the above programme shall be made subject to the eligibility, qualifications and specialization prescribed by the University for each programme, from time to time. Admissions shall be made either based on merit rank obtained by the qualified candidates at an Entrance Test conducted by the University or on the basis of ICET score, subject to reservations prescribed by the University or Government policies from time to time.

2. AWARD OF MCA DEGREE:

A student will be declared eligible for the award of the MCA Degree if he/she fulfills the following academic regulations:

- i. He/she has pursued a course of study for not less than two academic years and not more than four academic years.
- ii. Student shall register for 90 credits and secures all 90 credits to become eligible for award of MCA degree.

Note: Students who fail to fulfill all the academic requirements for the award of the Degree within four academic years from the year of their admission, shall forfeit their seat in the course and their seat shall stand cancelled.

3. EVALUATION:

- 3.1 The performance of the candidate in each semester shall be evaluated subject wise, with a maximum of 100 marks for theory and 100 marks for practical examination, based on Internal Evaluation and End Semester Examination.
- 3.2 For theory subjects the distribution of marks shall be 40 marks for Internal Evaluation and 60 marks for the end examination

3.2.1 Internal Examination

Two Midterm Examinations shall be held during the semester for 40 marks. First midterm examination shall be conducted for I & II units of syllabus and

second midterm examination shall be conducted for III, IV & V units of syllabus. In each midterm exam, a student shall answer all three questions in 2 hours of time without seeking any choice. Final Internal marks for a total of 40 marks shall be arrived at by considering the marks secured by the student in both the internal examinations with 80% weightage to the better internal exam and 20% to the other.

3.2.2 End Examination

The following pattern shall be followed in the End Examination.

- Five questions shall be set from each of the five units with either/or type for 12 marks each.
- All the questions are to be answered compulsorily.
- · Each question may consist of one, two or more bits.
- 3.3 For practical subjects, 60 marks shall be for the End Semester Examinations and 40 marks will be for internal evaluation based on the day to day performance.
- 3.4 There shall be no external examination for mandatory courses with zero credits. However, attendance shall be considered while calculating aggregate attendance and student shall be declared to have passed the mandatory course only when he/she secures 50% or more in the mid semester examinations. In case, the student fails, a re-examination shall be conducted for failed candidates every six months/semester at a mutually convenient date of college/student satisfying the conditions mentioned in item 2 of the regulations.
- 3.5 Elective I shall be pursued under MOOC of minimum 40 hours duration with the approval of the head of the institution
 - One mentor for each MOOC course shall be appointed.
 - MOOCs is pursued through online it should be standard providers like NPTEL, SWAYAM, etc. The student has to submit course completion certificate. Accordingly, grades will be awarded by the university. If the student fails in the course, university will conduct supplementary examination for 100 marks following the university norms.
 - If standard providers are not offering the courses listed in under elective II, the
 institute shall offer the course through offline or online mode by following the
 university norms. Attendance is not compulsory.
- 3.6 There shall be a **Comprehensive Viva–Voce** in IV Semester. The Comprehensive viva-voce will be conducted by the committee consisting of Head of the Department and two senior faculty members of the department. The Comprehensive Viva–voce is aimed to assess the students' understanding in various subjects he/she studies during the programme. The Comprehensive Viva-Voce shall be evaluated for 50 marks by the committee. There are no internal marks for the Comprehensive Viva-Voce. A student shall acquire 2 credits assigned to the Comprehensive Viva–voce when he/she secures

50% or more marks for the total of 50 marks. In case, if a student fails in Comprehensive Viva–voce he/she shall reappear as and when IV semester supplementary examinations are conducted. The Comprehensive Viva–voce shall be conducted anytime during the semester as per the convenience of the department committee and students. There shall be no external examination for Comprehensive Viva–Voce.

- 3.7 *Project*: Individual Project shall be allotted to each student in any topic suggested by the concern supervisor of the college as per the following:
 - Project will be allotted at the 3rd Semester and no marks are awarded in 3rd Semester
 - Out of a total of 200 marks for the Project, 80 marks shall be for Internal Evaluation and 120 marks for the End Semester Examination (Viva-voce).
 - The Internal Evaluation shall be made by the departmental committee (Head of the Department, two senior faculty members of the department and Supervisor), on the basis of two seminars given by each student on the topic of his/her project.
 - The Viva-Voce (External Examination) shall be conducted by a committee consisting of HOD, Project Supervisor and an External Examiner nominated by the University.
- 3.8 A candidate shall be deemed to have secured the minimum academic requirement in a subject if he/she secures a minimum of 40% of marks in the End Examination and a minimum aggregate of 50% of the total marks in the End Semester Examination and Internal Evaluation taken together.
- 3.9 In case the candidate does not secure the minimum academic requirement in any of the subjects (as specified in 3.8) he/she has to reappear for the Semester Examination either supplementary or regular in that subject.

4. ATTENDANCE:

- 4.1 A candidate shall be deemed to have eligibility to write end semester examinations if he/she has put in at least 75% of attendance on cumulative basis of all subjects/courses in the semester.
- 4.2 Condonation of shortage of attendance up to 10% i.e., from 65% and above and less than 75% may be granted by the College Academic Committee.
- 4.3 Condonation of shortage of attendance shall be granted only on genuine and valid reasons on representation by the candidate with supporting evidence.
- 4.4 A stipulated fee shall be payable towards condonation of shortage of attendance.
- 4.5 If the candidate does not satisfy the attendance requirement, he/she is detained for want of attendance and shall reregister for that semester. He / she shall not be promoted to the next semester.

5. RE-REGISTRATION FOR IMPROVEMENT OF INTERNAL EVALUATION MARKS:

Following are the conditions to avail the benefit of improvement of internal evaluation marks.

- 5.1 The candidate should have completed the course work for all four semesters pending Project work submission.
- 5.2 He should have passed all the subjects for which the Internal evaluation marks secured are more than 50%.
- 5.3 Out of the subjects the candidate has failed in the examinations due to Internal evaluation marks secured being less than 50%, the candidate shall be given one chance for each Theory subject and for a maximum of **three** Theory subjects for Improvement of Internal evaluation marks.
- 5.4 The candidate has to re-register for the chosen subjects and fulfill the academic requirements.
- 5.5 For each subject, the candidate has to pay a fee equivalent to one third of the semester tuition fee and the amount is to be remitted in the form of D.D in favour of 'the Registrar, JNTUA' payable at Anantapur along with the requisition through the principal of the respective college.
- 5.6 In the event of availing the Improvement of Internal evaluation marks, the internal evaluation marks as well as the End Examinations marks secured in the previous attempt(s) for the reregistered subjects stand cancelled.

6. AWARD OF GRADES

After each subject is evaluated for 100 marks, the marks obtained in each subject will be converted to a corresponding letter grade as given below:

A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear for that subject when the next supplementary examination offered.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e.

SGPA =
$$\sum_{i=1}^{n} (\text{Ci} \times \text{Gi}) / \sum_{i=1}^{n} \text{Ci}$$

Where, Ci is the number of credits of the ith subject, Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course and n is the no. of subjects.

The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be computed in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a program, i.e.

$$CGPA = \sum_{i=1}^{n} (Ci \times Si) / \sum_{i=1}^{n} Ci$$

Where 'Si' is the SGPA of the ith semester, Ci is the total number of credits in that semester and n is the no. of semesters.

Both SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

While computing the SGPA the subjects in which the student is awarded Zero grade points will also be included.

Grade Point: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.

Letter Grade: It is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters as mentioned in the above table.

7. AWARD OF CLASS:

After a student has satisfied the requirements prescribed for the completion of the programme and is eligible for the award of MCA Degree he shall be placed in one of the following four classes:

8. MINIMUM INSTRUCTION DAYS

The minimum instruction for each semester shall be 90 working Days excluding examination days.

9. WITH – HOLDING OF RESULTS:

If the candidate has not paid dues to the university or if any case of in-discipline is pending against him, the result of the candidate shall be withheld, and he will not be allowed/ promoted into the next higher semester. The issue of degree is liable to be withheld in such cases.

10. TRANSITORY REGULATIONS:

Candidates who have discontinued or have been detained for want of attendance or who have failed after having undergone the course in earlier regulations and wish to continue the course are eligible for admission into the unfinished semester from the date of commencement of class work with the same or equivalent subjects as and when subjects are offered, subject to sections 2.1 Whereas they continue to be in the academic regulations they were first admitted.

General:

- 11. Where the word "he", "him", "his", occur in the regulations, they include "she", "her", "hers".
- 12. The academic regulation should be read as a whole for the purpose of any interpretation.
- 13. In the case of any doubt or ambiguity in the interpretation of the above rules, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor is final.
- 14. The University may change or amend the academic regulations or syllabi at any time and the changes or amendments made shall be applicable to all the students with effect from the dates notified by the university.

Malpractices identified by squad or special invigilators
